





Expanded by Herod the Great and named in honor of his patron, Caesar Augustus, this city was known for its splendid buildings. It would become a Roman administrative center.

The birthplace of Herod the Great, an Idumean. He built magnificent fountains and baths to beautify the city.

The Decapolis was a commercial league whose member cities enjoyed a measure of autonomy within the Roman province.

Herod Antipas held court in a palace built as part of a fortress; it was here, according to Josephus, that Salome danced and John the Baptist was beheaded. (Matthew 14:3-12)


Herod the Great constructed an elaborate monument and temple over the traditional tomb of the patriarchs.

Once a treasure-house fortress of the Hasmoneans, it had been torn down by the Romans. Herod the Great rebuilt it as a fortress and prison.
