- **1879 – Founds Northfield Seminary for Young Women**

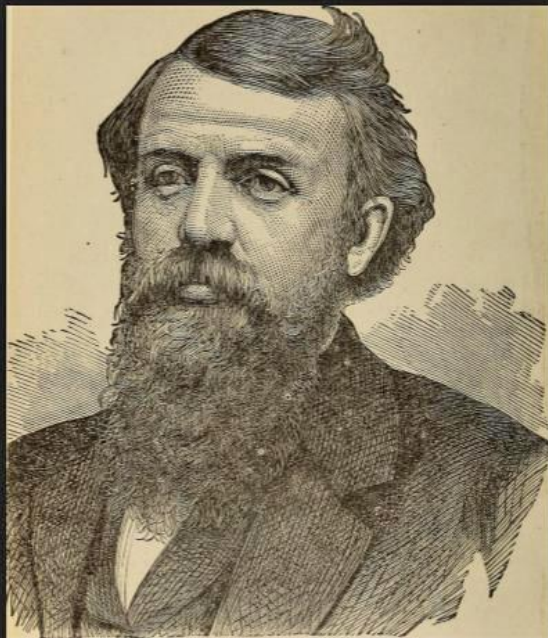

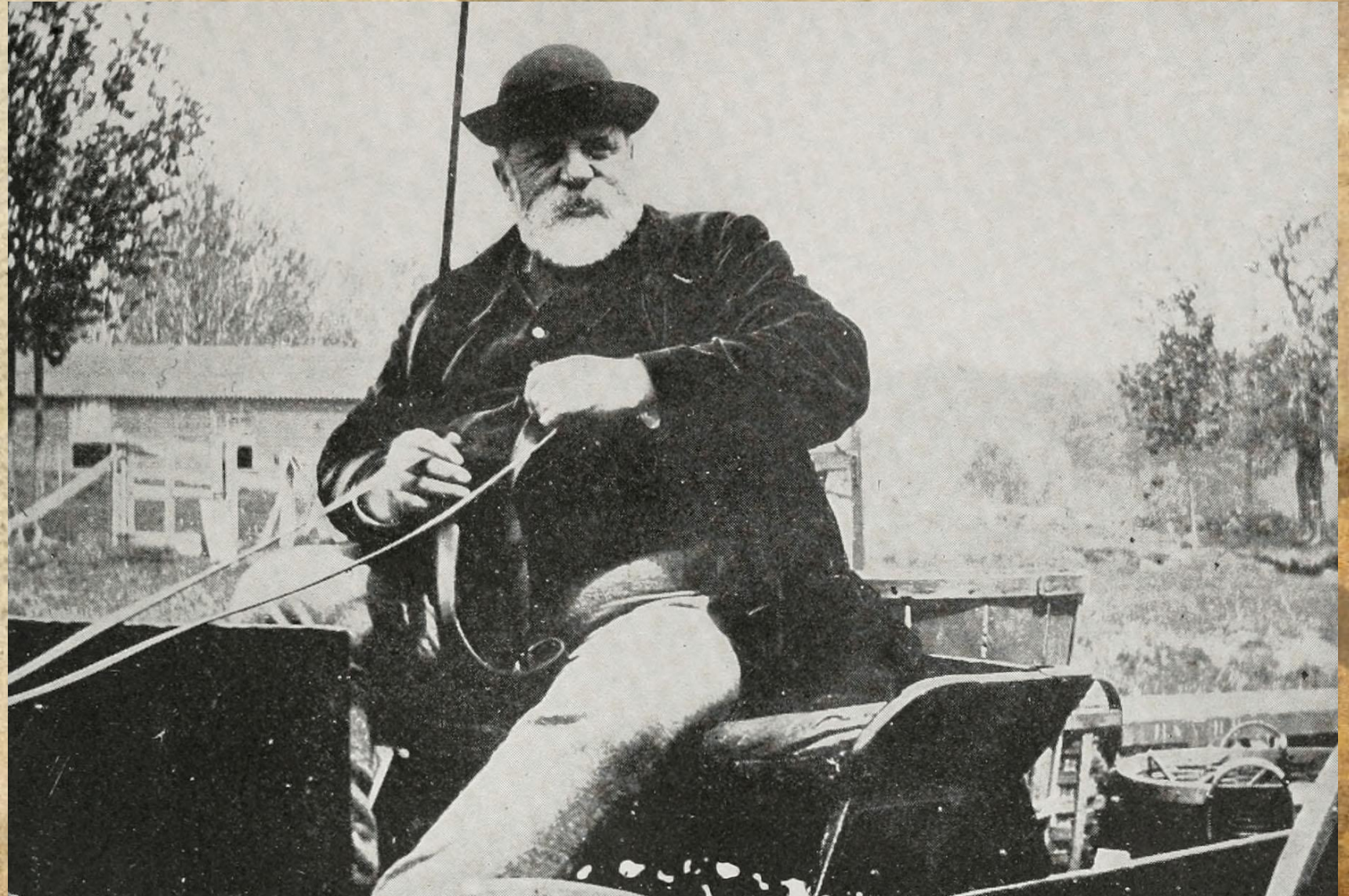

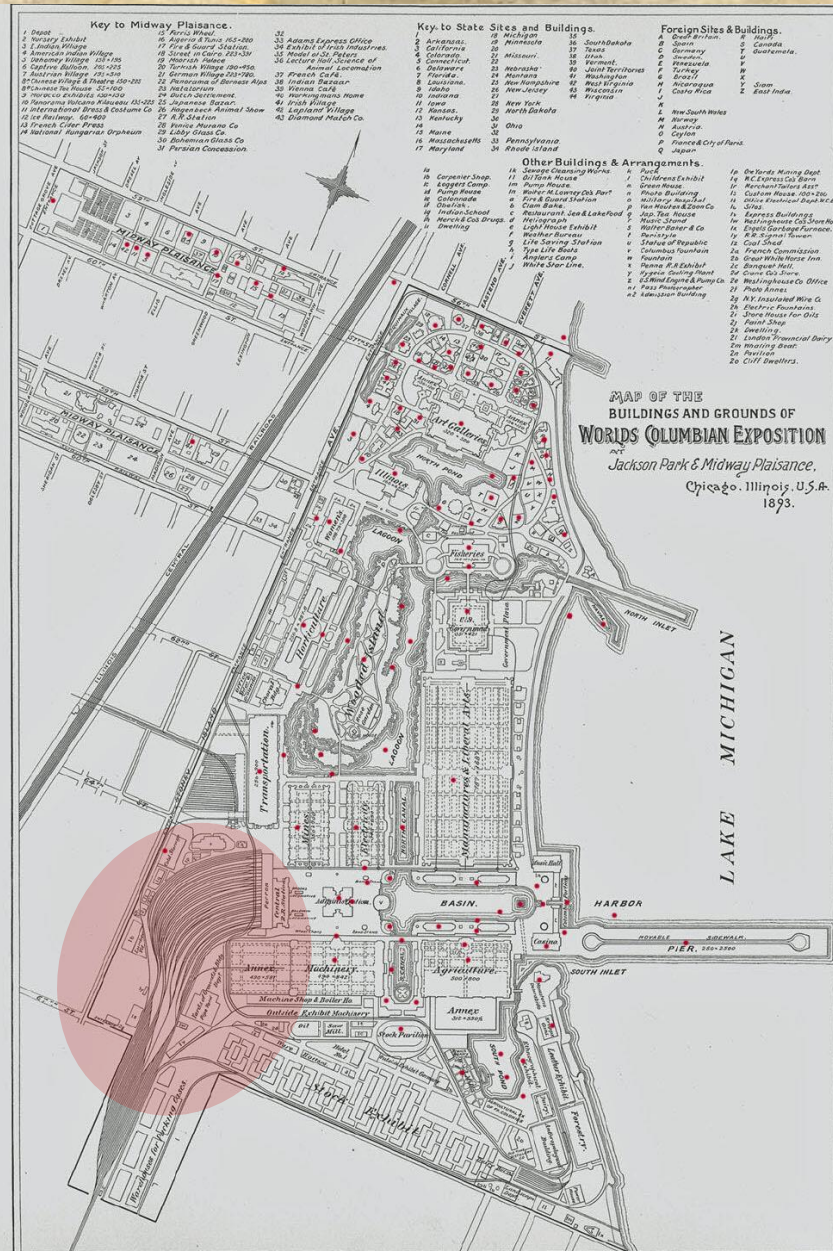

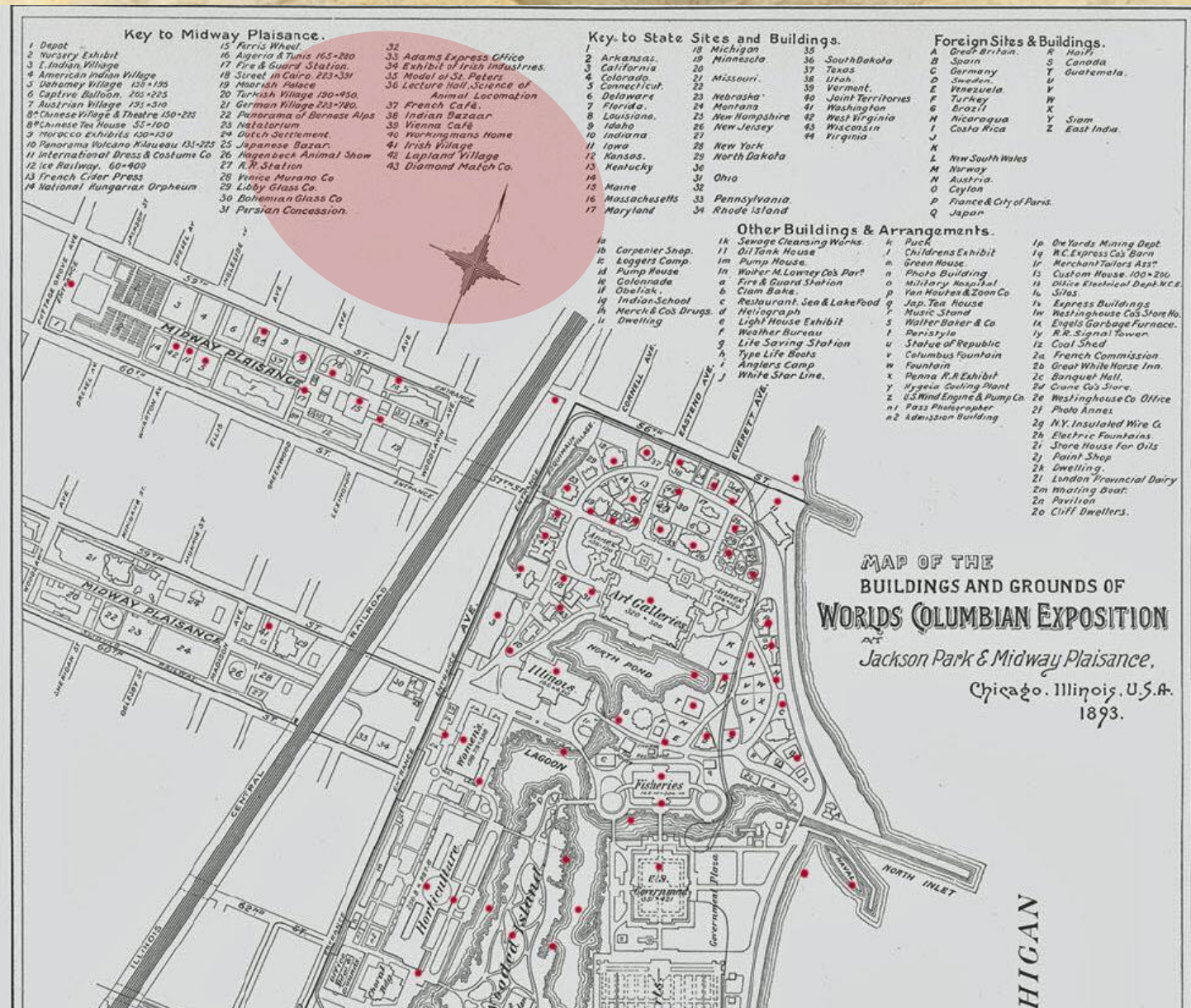

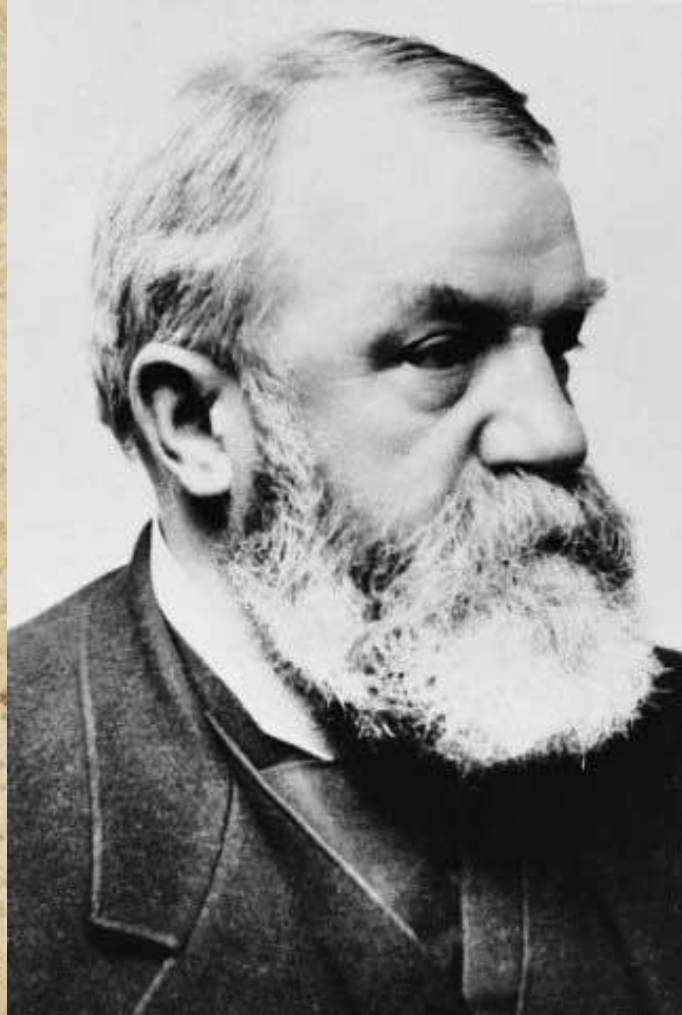

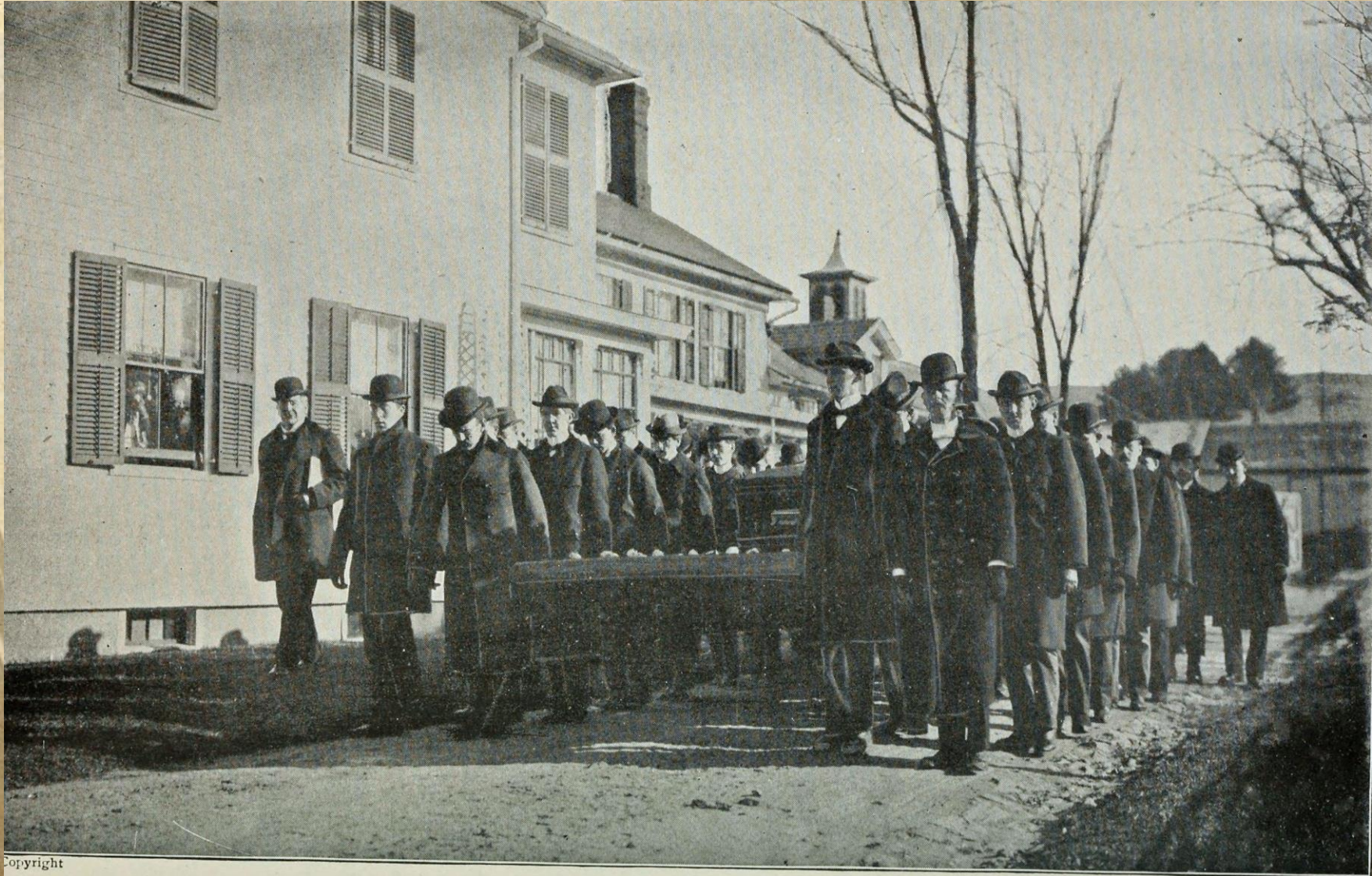
