



Cup of Trembling

OT:7478

ra`al (rah'-al); from OT:7477; a reeling (from intoxication): KJV - trembling.

OT:8653

tar'elah (tar-ay-law'); from OT:7477; reeling:

KJV - astonishment, trembling.

OT:7477

ra`al (raw-al'); a primitive root; to reel, i.e. (figuratively) to brandish:

KJV - terribly shake.

Burdensome Stone

OT:4614

ma`amacah (mah-am-aw-saw'); from <u>OT:6006;</u> burdensomeness:

KJV - burdensome.

OT:6006

`amac (aw-mas'); or `amas (aw-mas'); a primitive root; to load, i.e. impose a burden (or figuratively, infliction):

KJV - be borne, (heavy) burden (self), lade, load, put.



Hand

NT:5495

cheir (khire); perhaps from the base of NT:5494 in the sense of its congener the base of NT:5490 (through the idea of hollowness for grasping); the hand (literally or figuratively [power]; especially [by Hebraism] a means or instrument):

KJV - hand.

NT:5494

cheimon (khi-mone'); from a derivative of cheo (to pour; akin to the base of NT:5490 through the idea of a channel), meaning a storm (as pouring rain); by implication, the rainy season, i.e. winter:

KJV - tempest, foul weather, winter.

NT:5490

chasma (khas'-mah); from a form of an obsolete prim chao (to "gape" or "yawn"); a "chasm" or vacancy (impassable interval):

KJV - gulf.
