


Four Species



The symbolism is as follows:

- The *lulav-date palm* has taste but no smell, symbolizing those who study Torah but do not possess good deeds.
- The hadass-myrtle has a good smell but no taste, symbolizing those who possess good deeds but do not study Torah.
- The aravah-willow has neither taste nor smell, symbolizing those who lack both Torah and good deeds.
- The etrog-citron has both a good taste and a good smell, symbolizing those who have both Torah and good deeds.

"And you shall make a crown of pure gold, and engrave on it in the manner of a signet ring, "Holy to HaShem." (Exodus 28:36) The tzitz was a thin plate of pure, solid gold, worn across the forehead of the kohen gadol, from ear to ear. A second plate of gold fit around the back of the High Priest's head and the two were tied together with woolen threads dyed with sky-blue techelet dye.
