












Newforeign Roman gods... Mithras


- Men Only, particularly popular with the Roman military
- Mystery Religion
- Seven Grades of Initiation
- Thousands of Mithraems (places of worship) have been found from Britain to Syria. It is estimated that there were 680 in Rome alone. All built underground.
- Thousands of Images of Mithras have been discovered.
- Birth from the rock, bull sacrifice, association with sun and the stars as well as snakes, dogs, and scorpions.















Newforeign Roman gods... Cybele

- Mystery Religion worshiped in a Metroon close to the city center.
- She arrives on a chariot pulled by Lions with Attis as her Consort.
- Here followers were characterized by their wine consumption as well as wild immoral parties and events.
- Her rise came in Rome during the 2nd war against Carthage (218 to 201 B.C.)
- During Augustus Caesar's reign, one week in March was dedicated to her honor with processions, plays, & chariot races.
- She was portrayed as the protector of Roman Cities and the Empire as a whole.
- Associated with lions, forests, and violets.



Newforeign Roman gods... Serapis

- Cult was created promulgated by Ptolemy the first. His intent was to unify the Greeks and Egyptians.
- Patron god of Alexandria. Associated with abundance and resurrection.
- Attributes taken from Greek mythology with Egyptian trappings added.
- Took on chthonic or earthly characteristics of Zeus, Hades, Osiris, and other lesser gods.
- Worshiped in structures called Serapeum's.
