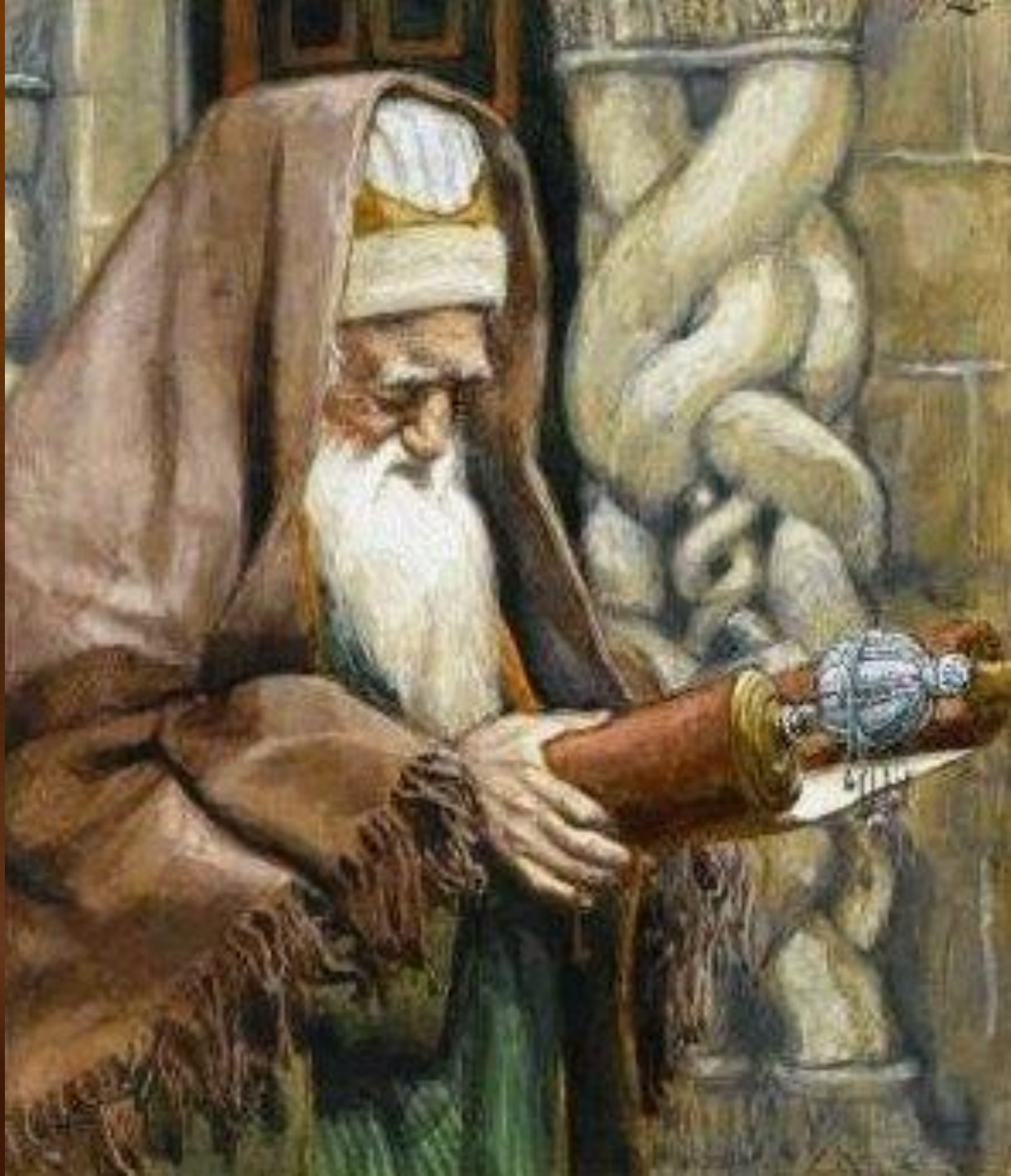

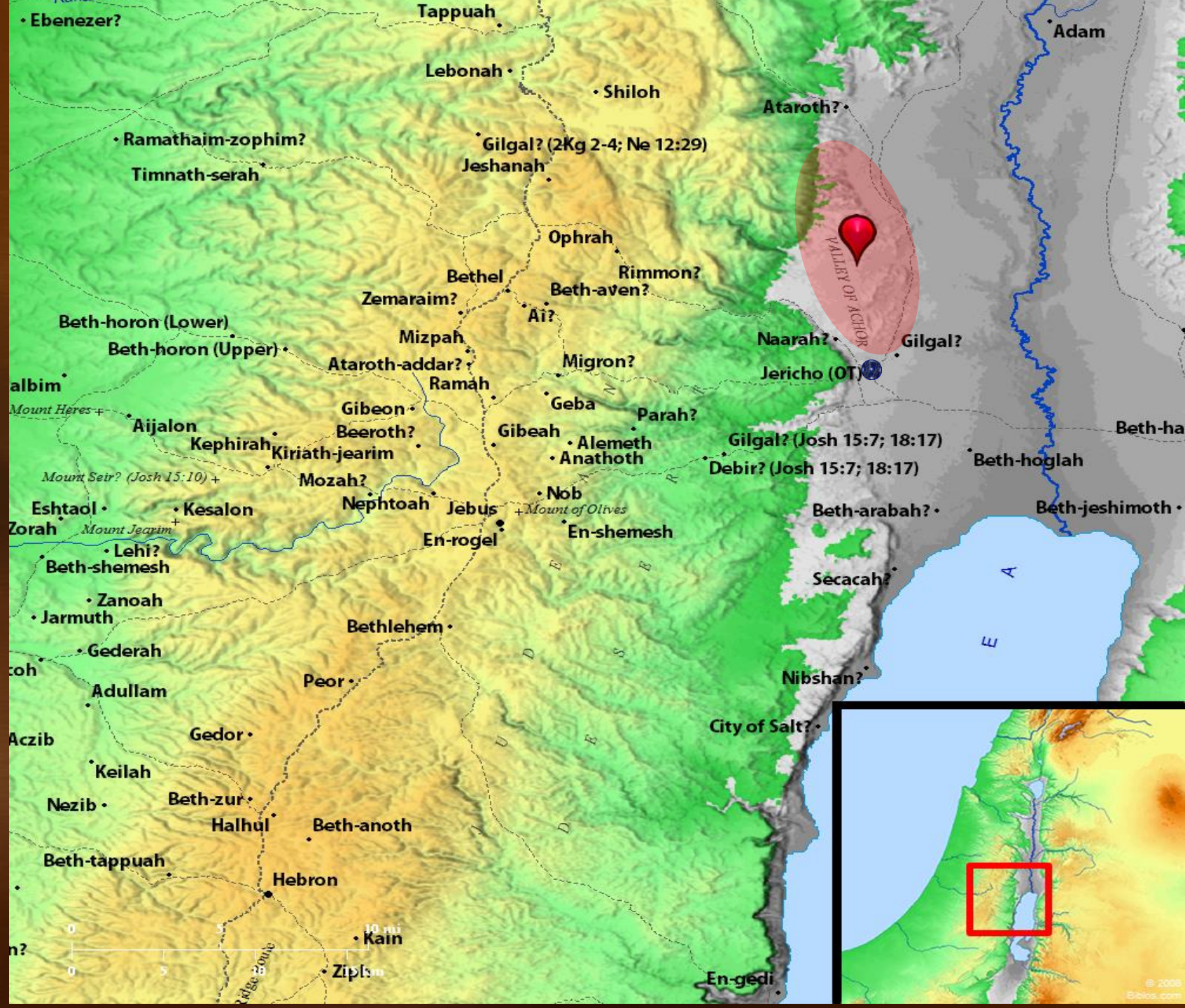

- Jonathan ben Annus (36–37 and 44)
- Theophilus ben Annus (37–41)
- Matthias ben Annus (43)
- Annus ben Annus (45-63) (Ananias in Acts 23:2)
