

- Jonathan ben Annus (36–37 and 44)
- Theophilus ben Annus (37–41)
- Matthias ben Annus (43)
- Annus ben Annus (45-63) (Ananias in Acts 23:2)








# Temple Comparison

Solomon's Temple, finished in 957 BC, was less than one-half the size of Herod the Great's expanded Second Temple in Jerusalem, built in 20-19 BC.

**diaprio** (dee-ap-ree'-o); from NT:1223 and the base of NT:4249; to saw asunder, i.e. (figuratively) to exasperate:


KJV - cut (to the heart).
