**diakrino** (dee-ak-ree'-no); to separate thoroughly, to withdraw from, or (by implication) oppose; figuratively, to discriminate (by implication, decide), or (reflexively) hesitate:

KJV - contend, make (to) differ (-ence), discern, doubt, judge, be partial, stagger, waver.



# Held Their Peace

NT:2270

**hesuchazo** (hay-soo-khad'-zo); to keep still (intransitively), i.e. refrain from labor, meddlesomeness or speech:

KJV - cease, hold peace, be quiet, rest.

# Held Their Peace

NT:4601

**sigao** (see-gah'-o); to keep silent (transitively or intransitively):

KJV - keep close (secret, silence), hold peace.



## The Roman Empire in 117 AD



NT:1675

Grecians

**Hellenistes** (hel-lay-nis-tace'); from a derivative of **NT:1672**; a Hellenist or Greek-speaking Jew:

KJV - Grecian.

NT:1672

**Hellen** (hel'-lane); a Hellen (Grecian) or inhabitant of Hellas; by extension a Greek-speaking person, especially a non-Jew:

KJV - Gentile, Greek.



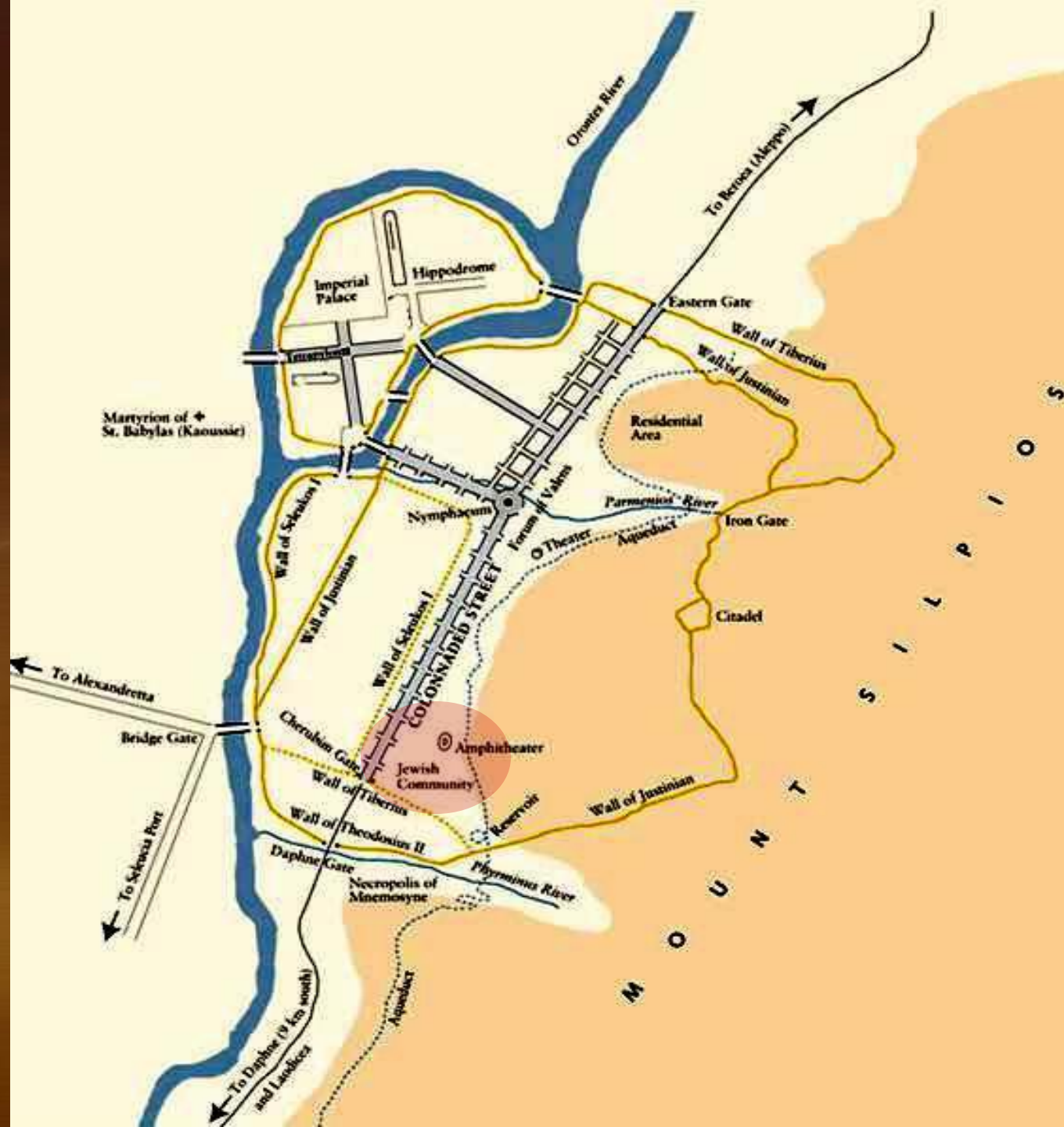

KJV - dearth, famine, hunger.

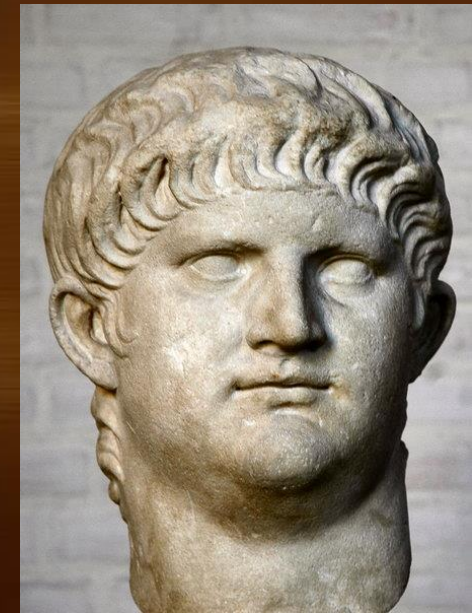

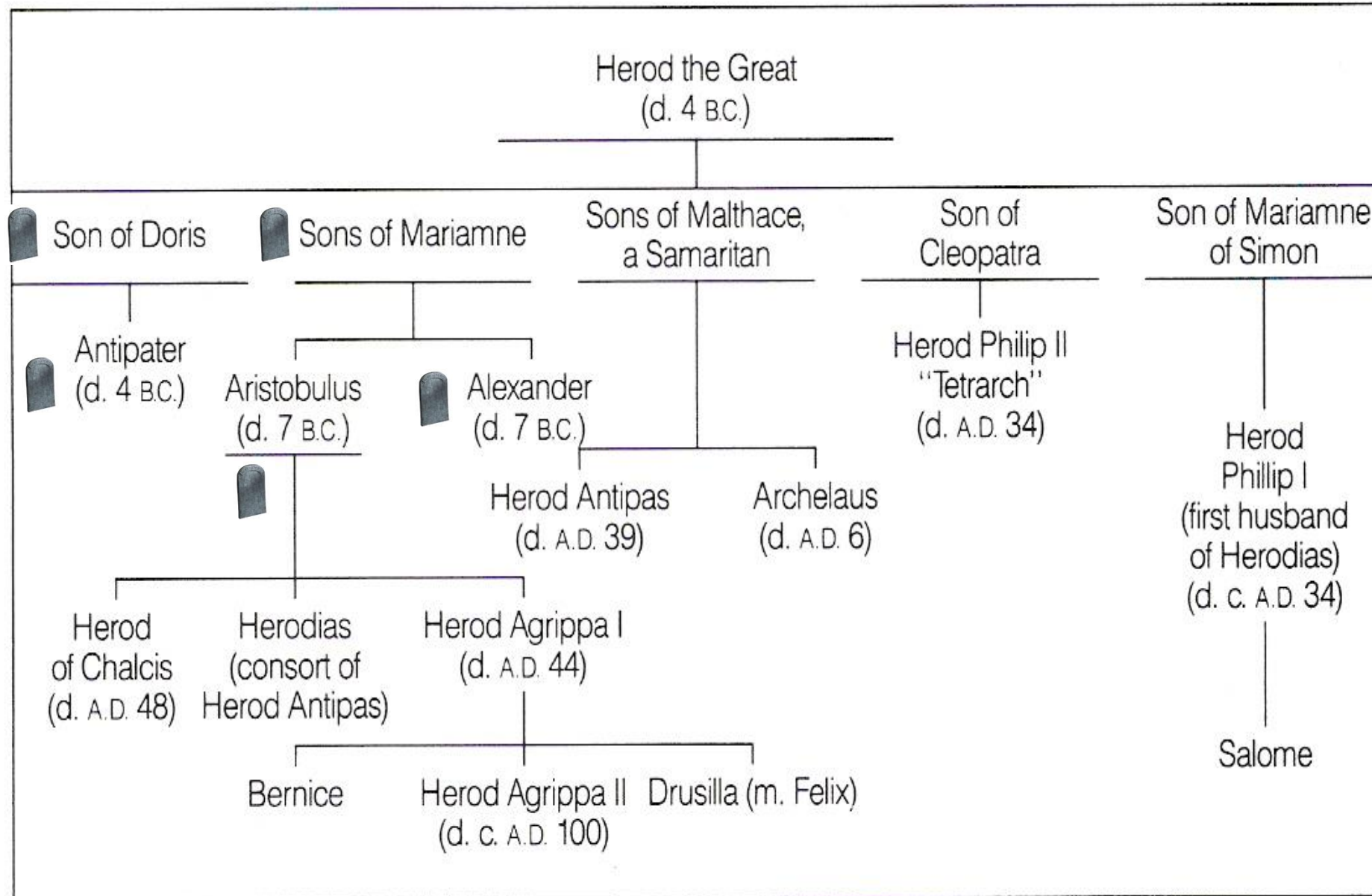

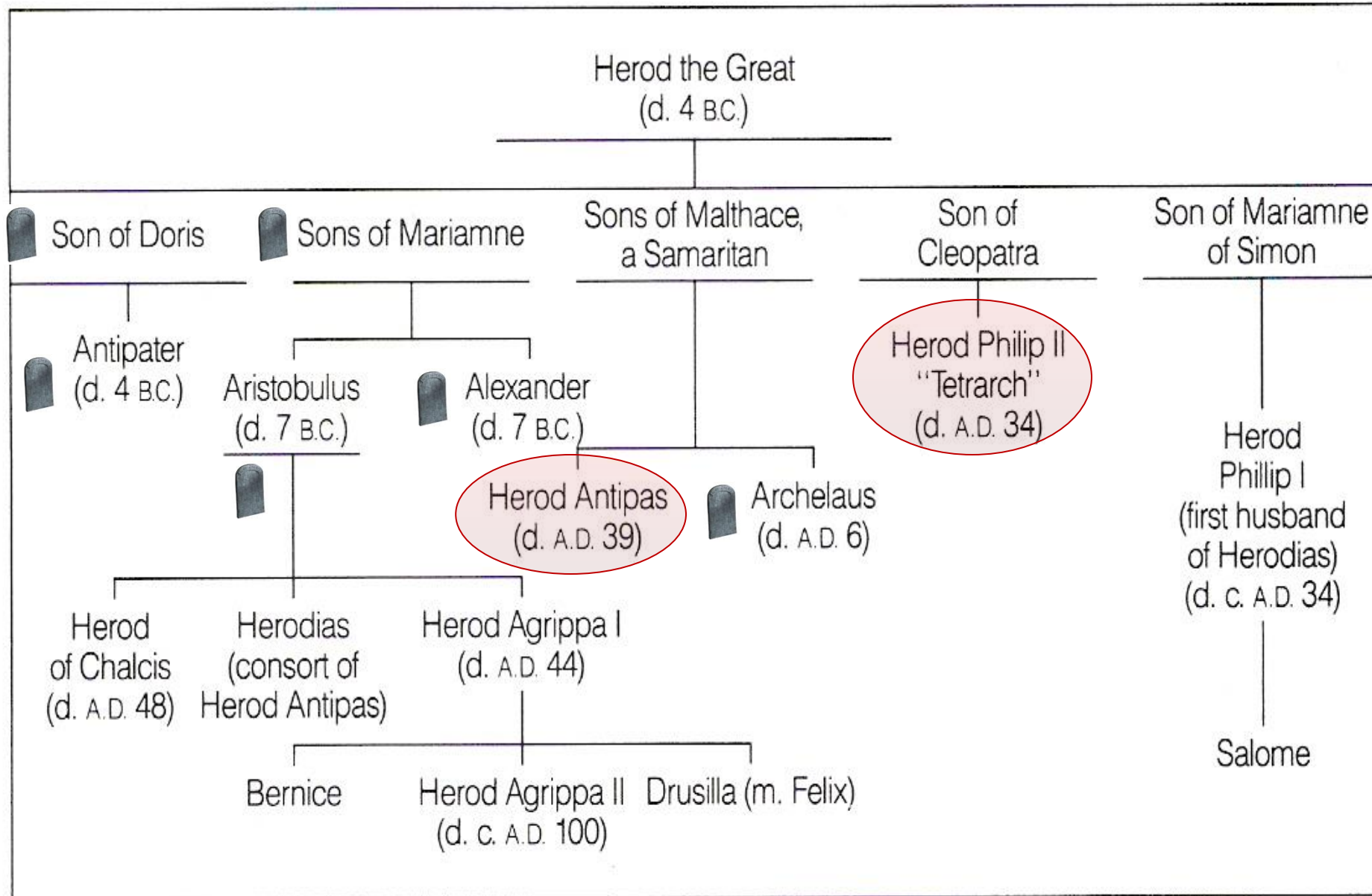


# Family Tree of Herod

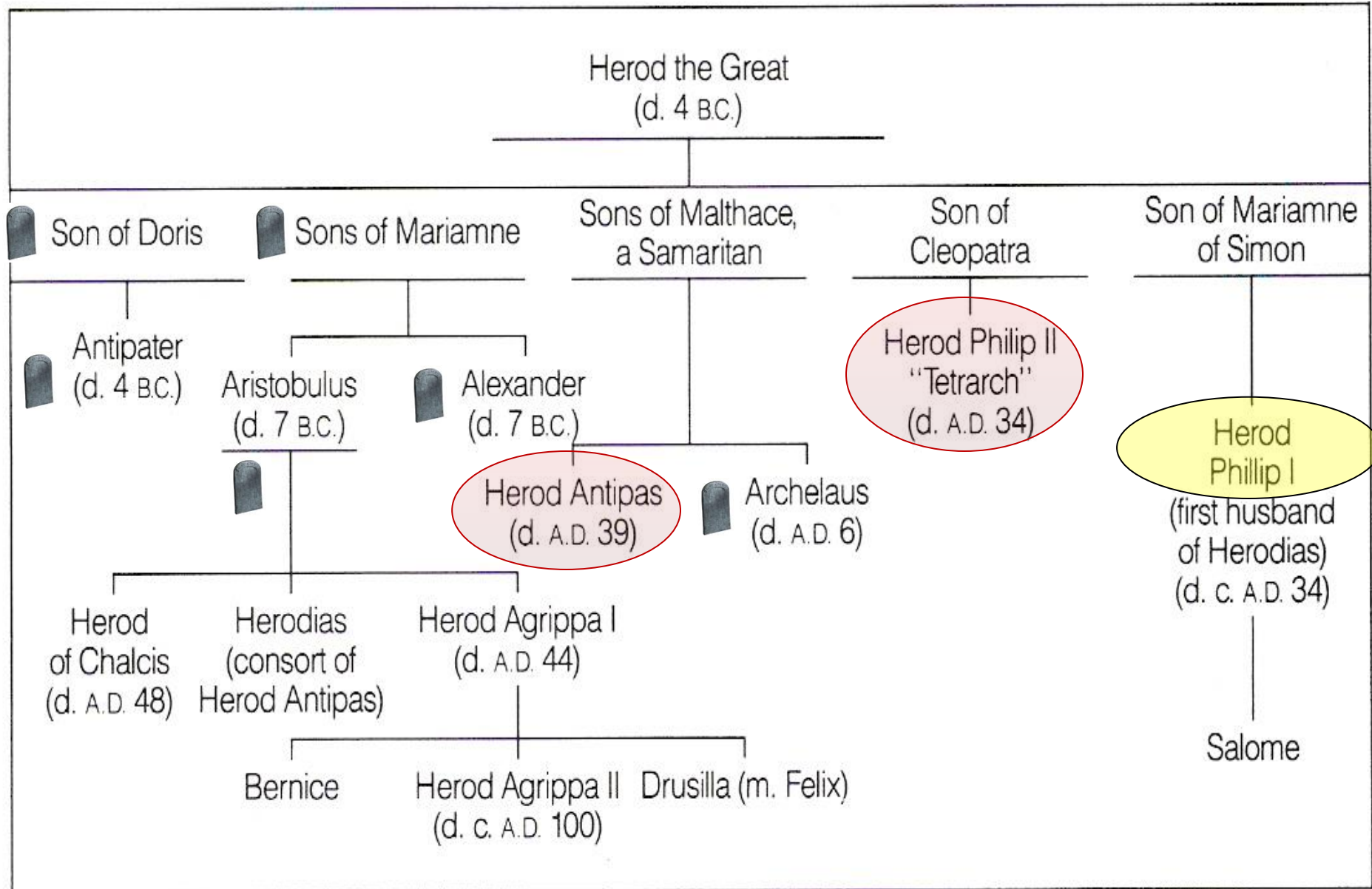




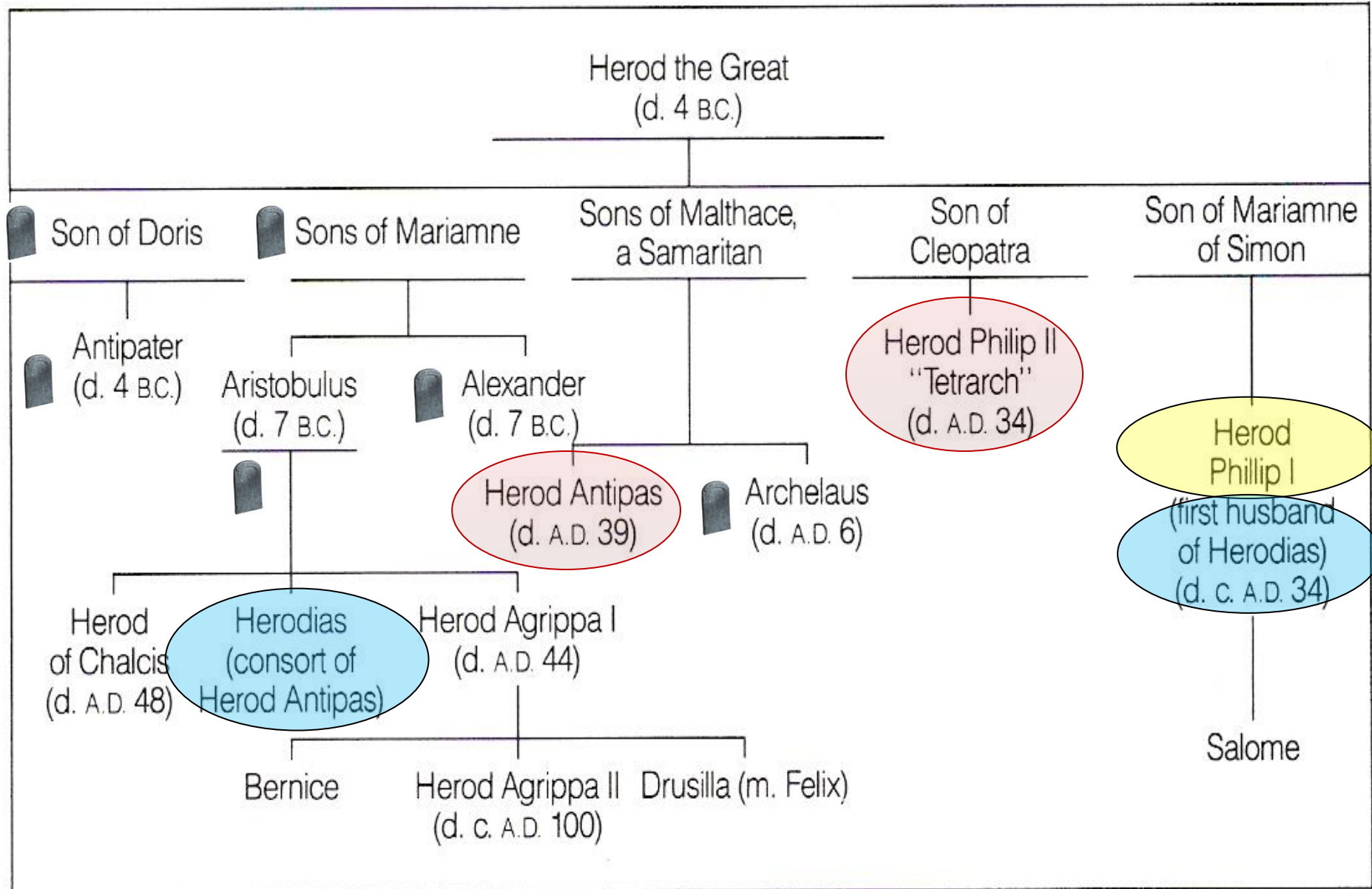

**Boanerges** (bo-an-erg-es'); of Aramaic origin [**OT:1123 and OT:7266**]; sons of commotion; Boanerges, an epithet of two of the apostles:

KJV - Boanerges.

**ben** (Aramaic) (bane); corresponding to OT:1121:

KJV - child, son, young.

OT:7266

**regaz** (Aramaic) (reg-az'); violent anger:

KJV - rage.
