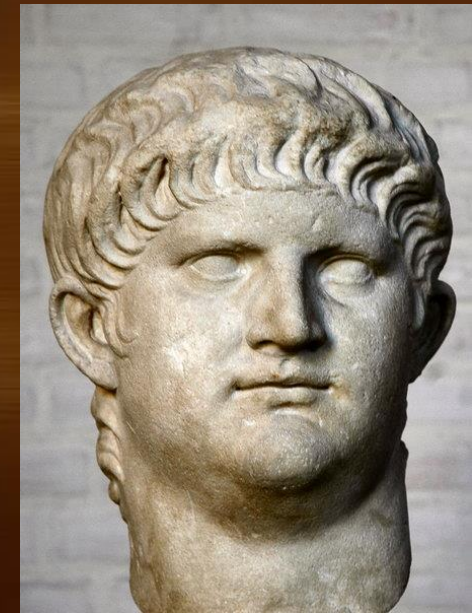

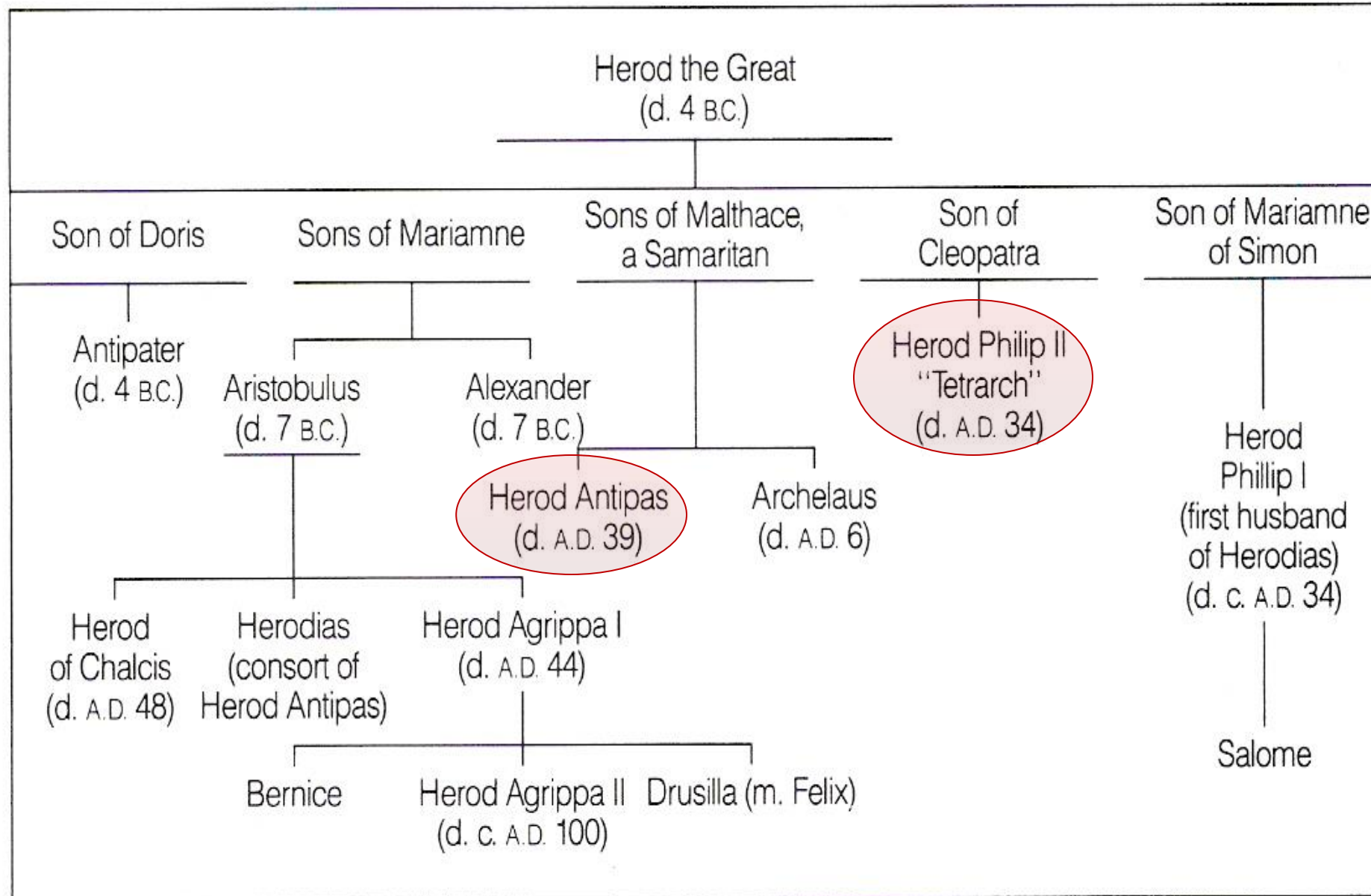

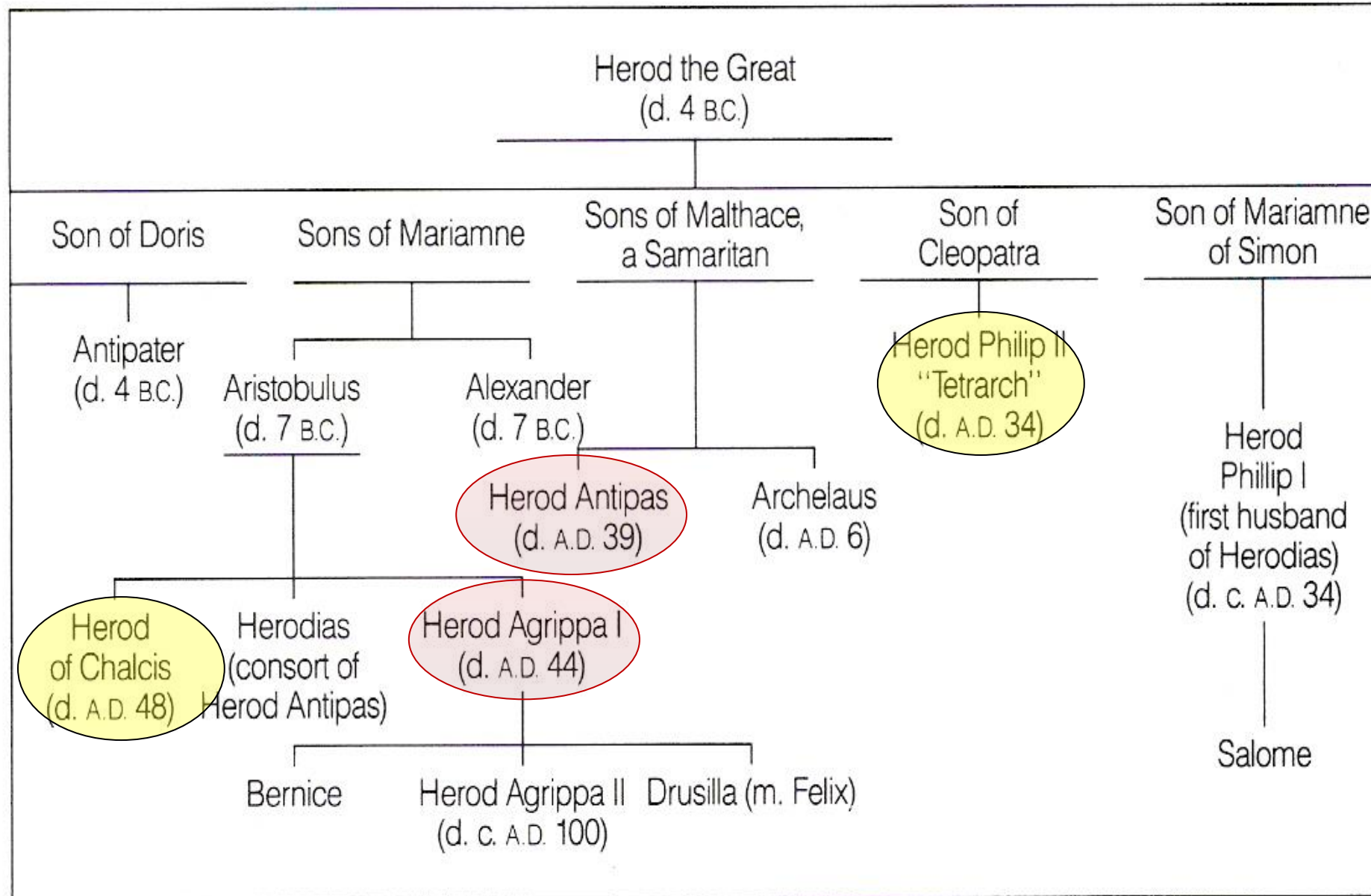

# Family Tree of Herod

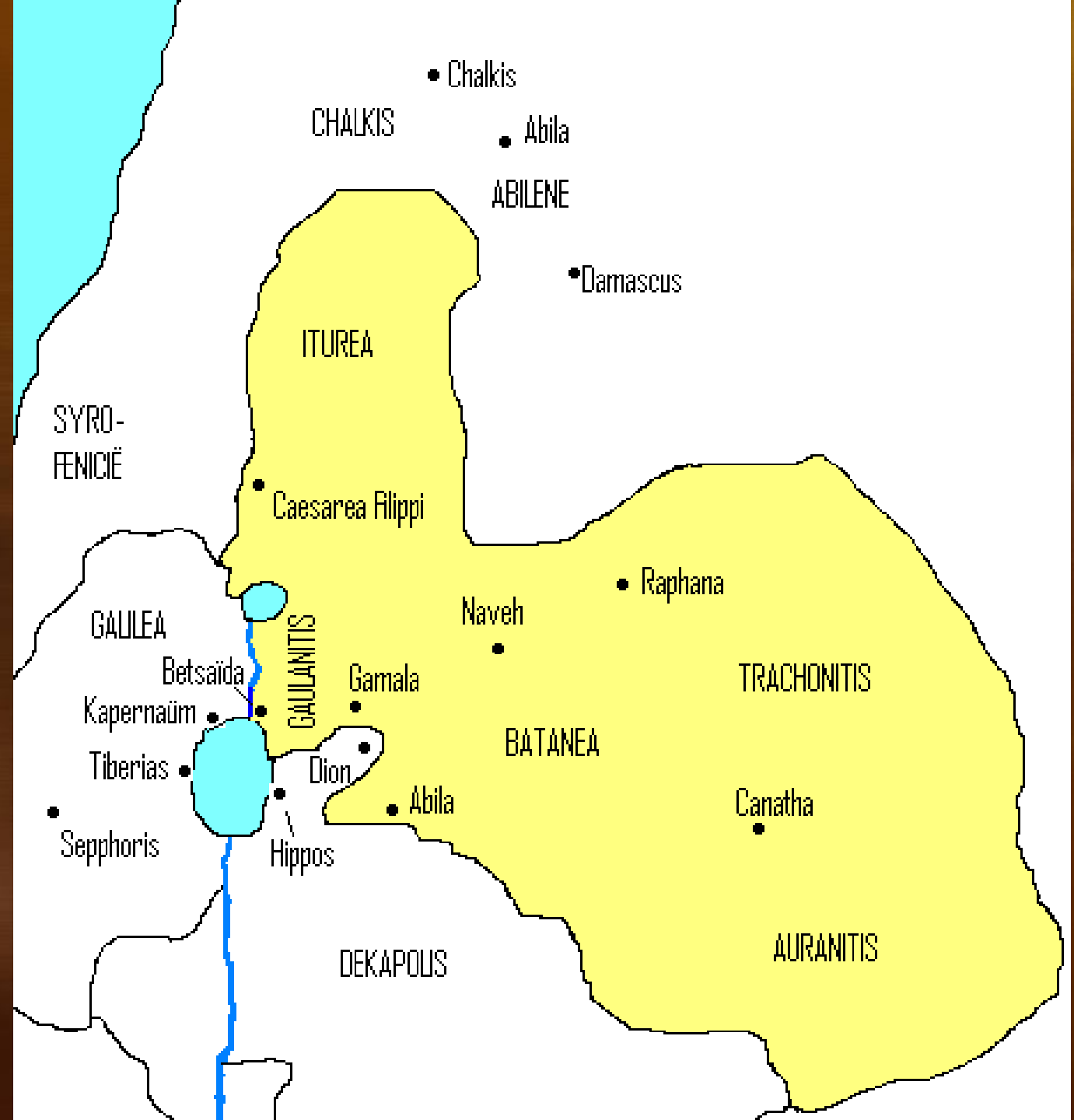

**Boanerges** (bo-an-erg-es'); of Aramaic origin [**OT:1123 and OT:7266**]; sons of commotion; Boanerges, an epithet of two of the apostles:

KJV - Boanerges.

OT:1123

**ben** (Aramaic) (bane); corresponding to OT:1121:

KJV - child, son, young.

OT:7266

**regaz** (Aramaic) (reg-az'); violent anger:

KJV - rage.

NT:5069

**tetradion** (tet-rad'-ee-on); a quaternion or squad (picket) of four Roman soldiers:

KJV - quaternion.

Quaternions

NT:3960

**patasso** (pat-as'-so); probably prolongation from NT:3817; to knock (gently or with a weapon or fatally):

KJV - smite, strike.

NT:3817

**paio** (pah'-yo); a primary verb; to hit (as if by a single blow); specifically, to sting (as a scorpion):

KJV - smite, strike.

**bema** (bay'-ma); a step, i.e. foot-breath; by implication, a rostrum, i.e. a tribunal:

KJV - judgment-seat, set [foot] on, throne.

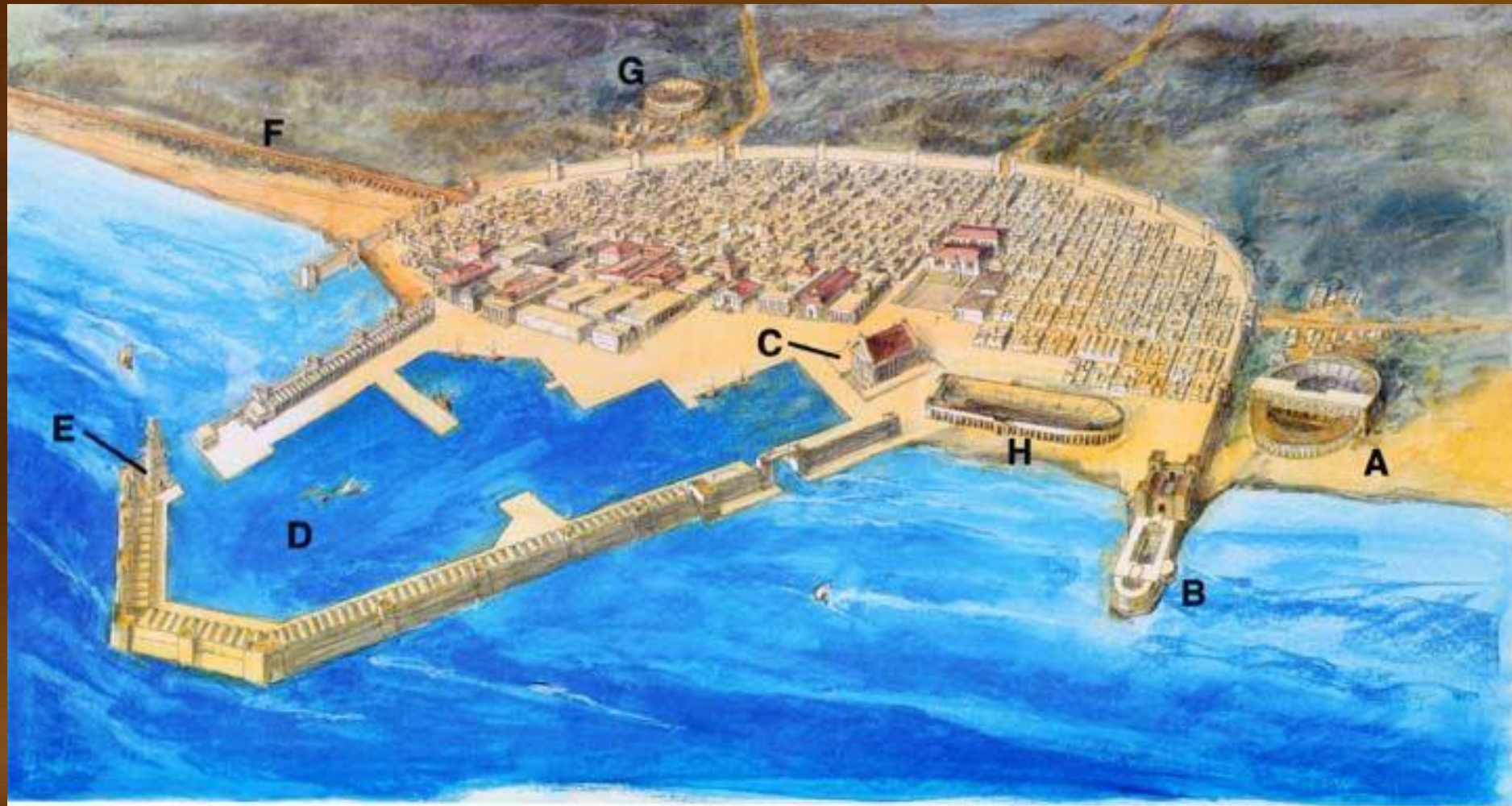

KJV - make an oration.

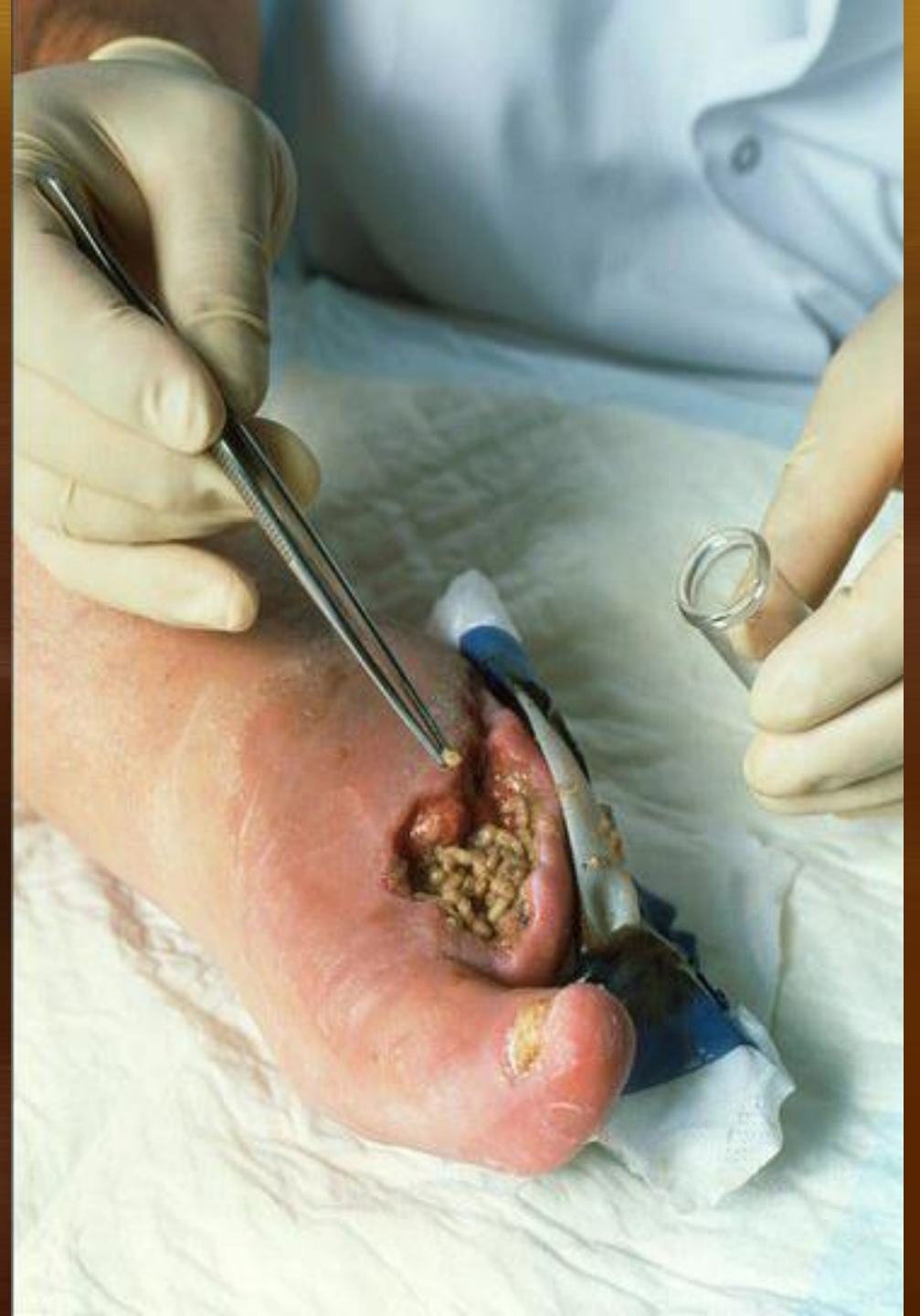
