



KJV - child, son, young.



patasso (pat-as'-so); probably prolongation from NT:3817; to knock (gently or with a weapon or fatally):


KJV - smite, strike.


paio (pah'-yo); a primary verb; to hit (as if by a single blow); specifically, to sting (as a scorpion):



KJV - judgment-seat, set [foot] on, throne.




