






| Corinthians 2:12-14

- 14 But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.





- Once he was recovered from the well, his mother picked him up and prayed "Lord, let him live!" She kissed him and breathed into him, and by the grace of God...he was revived.





Falling into a Well...

John 3:16-18

16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Housten, England

- At the age of 14, John Harper accepted Christ as his Savior.
- John's pastor encouraged the congregation and especially those that recently accepted Christ to listen for the Holy Spirits call for service. His pastor said that when you hear the call, we need to act on it.
- At the age of 18, John first began to preach on the streets of Houston. On most days, this was after he had worked a 14-hour day in the mill to support himself.
- He would give his testimony as the workers would head home each day. He also saw the needs in the slums and ghettos and coordinated the giving of food, clothes, and blankets. Among those he helped, he was called the "Angel of Houston."

- In his early 20s, the "Angel of Housten's" preaching and service came to the attention of noted pastor. A.E. Carter, was the head of the Baptist Pioneer Mission in London. He saw the young John Harper as a diamond in the rough that needed some polishing and seasoning. He convinced him to take a position in a small church in the poor shipbuilding suburb of Glasgow called Govan.
- In 1897 he was called as the first pastor of Paisley Road Baptist Church in Glasgow. The congregation of 50 soon grew to over 500. They purchased an old run-down warehouse and turned into a church home.
- One day John was invited to go to the beach with a couple of the families from his congregation.
 The joy of the day turned to terror...






1897 to 1908 Glasgow, Scotland

- Paisley Road Baptist Church continued to grow and needed to move to a new location. John was invited to
 conduct evangelistic meetings throughout Scotland. Dearest to his heart was street evangelism and
 continued to preach outside factories, mills, and shipyards wherever he could.
- John would marry in 1905 and his only daughter was born 1907. Annie Jessie Harper (Nana) would almost loose her father in 1908 when he went to preach at the Harland and Wolff shipyard in Northern Ireland. The shipyard was constructing three of the largest ships in the world. John had opportunity to speak to them as the left work.







- Sadly, J.P. Morgan & Bruce Ismay, the president of the White Star Line, continuously pressed the chief designer Thomas Andrews to keep costs low and compromise safety. As an example, lifeboats, original design 64, compromise of 32, final installation of only 16.



1909-1910 Glasgow, Scotland

- Continuing as pastor of Paisley Road Baptist Church and his evangelistic efforts, John suffered a devastating blow. His wife passes away. John was now a widower with a young daughter. How to care for her and still meet the needs of his church and ministry? God had a Plan.

- John's three months of meetings at Moody Memorial Church were such a blessing, he was invited back to conduct another four-month revival in 1912.
- He would purchase his passage on the newest and grandest ship in existence at the time. The Titanic. Its sister ship the Olympic was already carrying passengers across the Atlantic, but improvements and upgrades to Titanic made it even more grand.
- Sadly, when encouraging people to travel on the Titanic, the White Star Line would use this phrase, "Even God Himself couldn't sink the Titanic." Oh, how wrong they were...
