



Deactivated by earthquake in 1303 AD





Septuagint


- -~200 BC

Constructed ~356 BC



Deactivated in 407 AD as the Roman Empire became Christian




Diana (Roman) Artemis (Greek)



Artemis was the goddess of the hunt, the wilderness, wil d animals, nature, vegetation, childbirth, care of children, and chastity.









