Roman World Population Distribution








Temple Baptist Church — Statement of Faith

18. We do not believe in nor will we ever be a part of modernism, neo-evangelicalism, the charismatic movement, the ecumenical movement or extreme five-point Calvinism. (See definitions attached)

19. We are not a part of the Charismatic Movement, nor do we believe in the gift of tongues for today. We believe that God can and does heal, but only according to His will and Word. (James 5) We do not believe in "divine healers".

Charismatic Movement: The charismatic movement is an informal international and trans-denominational fellowship of Christians who believe that the sign gifts of the Holy Spirit described by Paul in I Cor. 12:4 - 11 and Gal. 5:22 - 23 are manifested in these times. Although related to Pentecostalism, the charismatic movement differs in not being denominationally organized. Doctrinal distinctions associated with the Charismatic movement include 1) Baptism with the Holy Spirit as a separate event, apart from the salvation experience, 2) Speaking in Tongues, 3) The continued use of all spiritual gifts (as opposed to a division between those intended for Apostolic times and those intended for the continuing New Testament Church)






Diana (Roman) Artemis (Greek)



Artemis was the goddess of the hunt, the wilderness, wild animals, nature, vegetation, childbirth, care of children, and chastity.

















