# Satan and His Many Names (OT & NT)

OT:7854

**satan** (saw-tawn'); from OT:7853; an opponent; especially Satan, the arch-enemy of good:

KJV - adversary, Satan, withstand.

NT:4567

**Satanas** (sat-an-as'); of Aramaic origin corresponding to NT:4566 the accuser, i.e. the devil:

KJV - Satan.

NT:4566

**Satan** (sat-an'); of Hebrew origin [OT:7854]; Satan, i.e. the devil:

KJV - Satan

# Satan and His Many Names (OT)

OT:1966

**heylel** (hay-lale'); from OT:1984 (in the sense of brightness); the morning-star:

KJV - Lucifer

OT:1984

**halal** (haw-lal'); a primitive root; to be clear, to shine; hence, to make a show, to boast; and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave; causatively, to celebrate; also to stultify:

KJV - (make) boast (self), celebrate, commend, (deal, make), fool (-ish, -ly), glory, give [light], be (make, feignself) mad (against), give in marriage, [sing, be worthy of] praise, rage, renowned, shine.

# Satan and His Many Names (NT)

NT:1228

**diabolos** (dee-ab'-ol-os); a traducer; specially, Satan [compare OT:7854]:

KJV - false accuser, devil, slanderer.

NT:1142

**daimon** (dah'-ee-mown); from daio (to distribute fortunes); a daemon or supernatural spirit (of a bad nature):

KJV - devil.

NT:1140

**daimonion** (dahee-mon'-ee-on); neuter of a derivative of NT:1142; a daemoniac being; by extension a deity:

KJV - devil, god.

NT:1139

**daimonizomai** (dahee-mon-id'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:1142; to be exercised by a daemon:

KJV - have a (be vexed with, be possessed with) devil (-s).

# Domitian's Temple

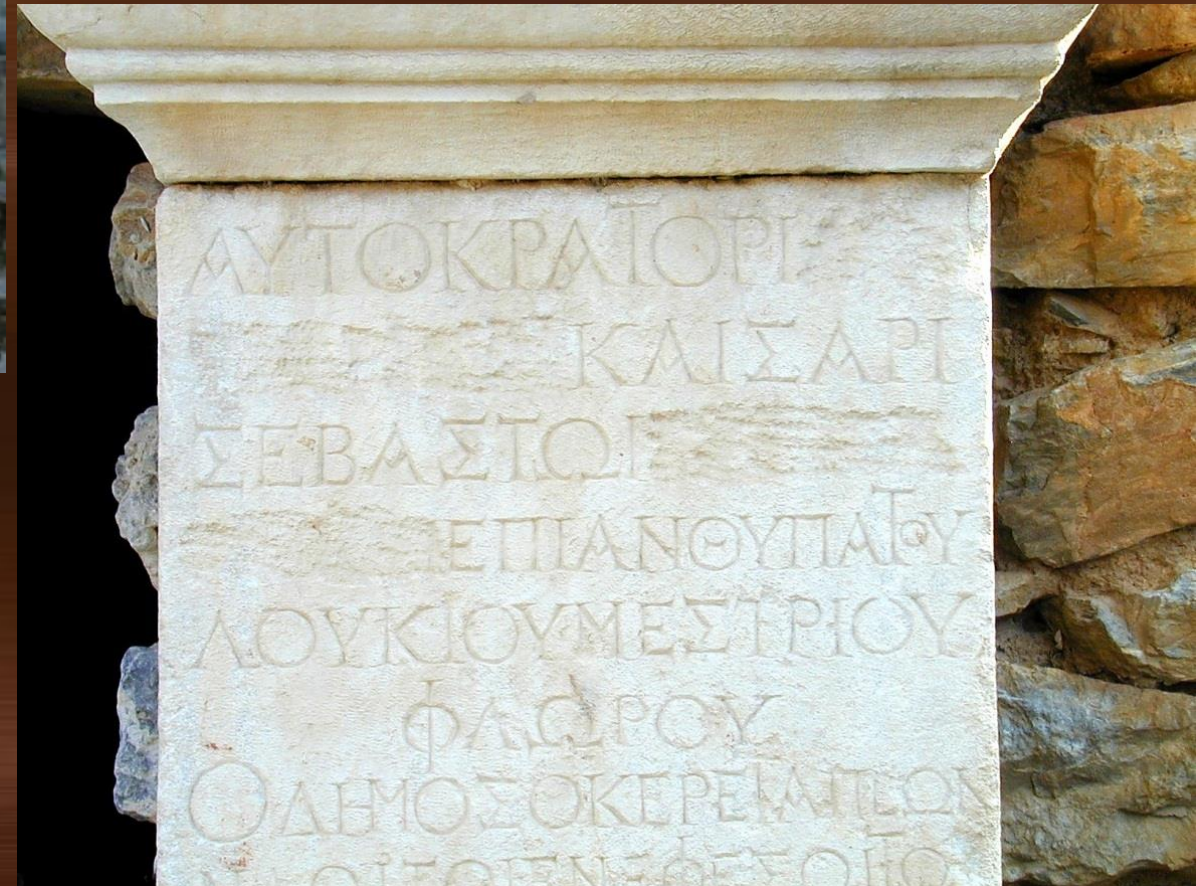
