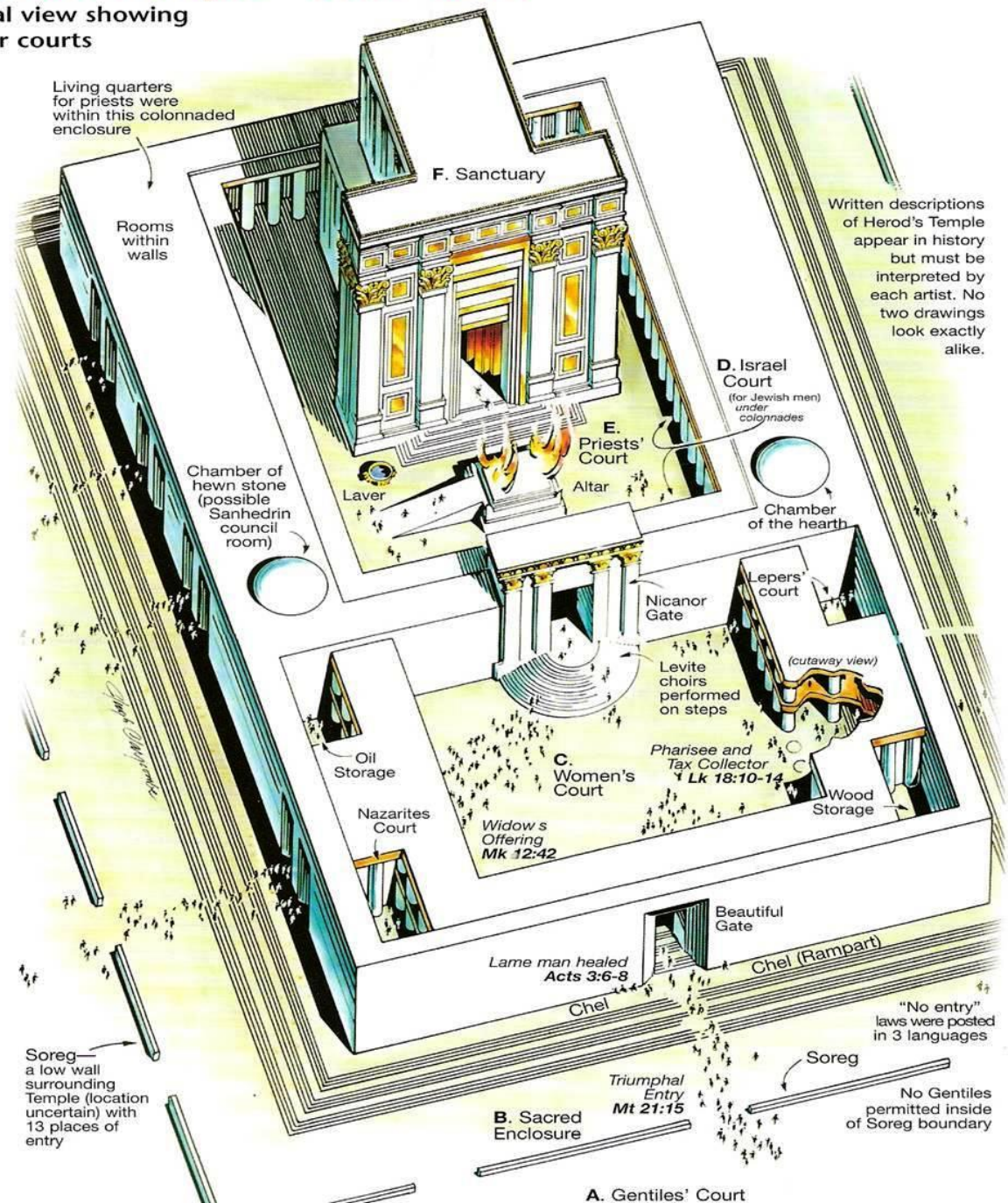
NT:4892 **Sunedrion** (soon-ed'-ree-on); compound of **NT:4862** and the base of **NT:1476**; a joint session, i.e. (specifically) the Jewish Sanhedrin; by analogy, a subordinate tribunal:
KJV - council.

NT:4862 **Sun** (soon); a primary preposition denoting union; with or together, i.e. by association, companionship, process, resemblance, possession, instrumentality, addition, etc.:
KJV - beside, with

NT:1476 **Hedraios** (hed-rah'-yos); from a derivative of hezomai (to sit); sedentary, i.e. (by implication) immovable:
KJV - settled, steadfast

outer courts

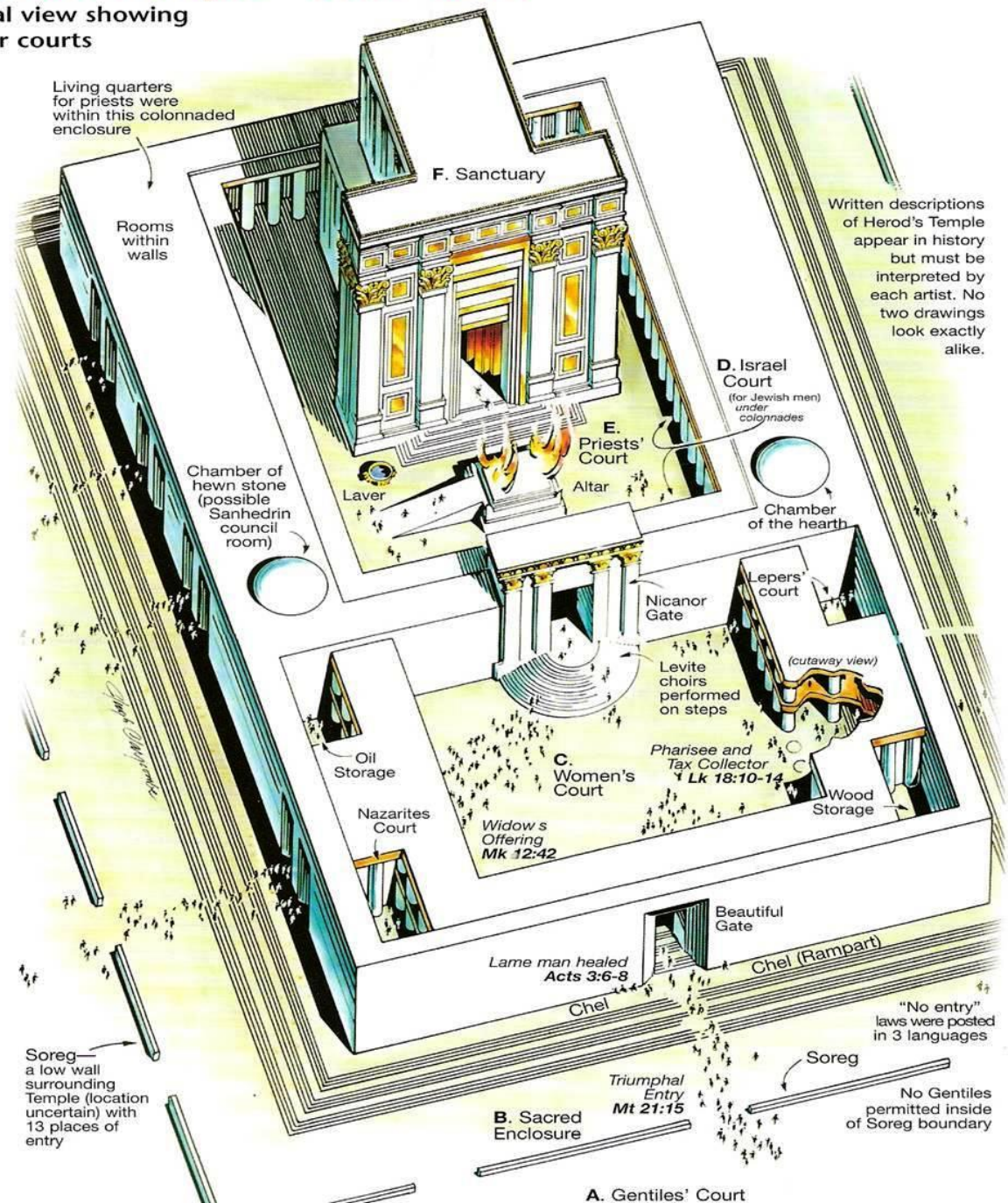


The Hall of Hewn (or Polished) Stones (Lishkat Ha-Gazith)

- Annas ben Seth (6–15)
- Eleazar ben Annas (16–17)
- Joseph ben Caiaphas (18–36) who had married the daughter of Annas
- Jonathan ben Annas (36–37 and 44)
- Theophilus ben Annas (37–41)
- Matthias ben Annas (43)
- Ananus ben Annas (63)

gods

OT:430

elohiym (el-o-heem'); gods in the ordinary sense; but specifically used (in the plural thus, especially with the article) of the supreme God; occasionally applied by way of deference to magistrates; and sometimes as a superlative:

KJV - angels, exceeding, God (gods)- dess, -ly), (very) great, judges, mighty.
