



NT:4892 Sunedrion (soon-ed'-ree-on); compound of NT:4862 and the base of NT:1476; a joint session, i.e. (specifically) the Jewish Sanhedrin; by analogy, a subordinate tribunal: KJV - council.

NT:4862 Sun (soon); a primary preposition denoting union; with or together, i.e. by association, companionship, process, resemblance, possession, instrumentality, addition, etc.: KJV - beside, with

NT:1476 Hedraios (hed-rah'-yos); from a derivative of hezomai (to sit); sedentary, i.e. (by implication) immovable: KJV - settled, stedfast




Do not consider it proof just because it is written in books, for a liar who will deceive with his tongue will not hesitate to do the same with his pen.
