
The Province Structure

This is the inscribed stone slab that mentions Pontius Pilate the Prefect of Judea that condemned Jesus to death

(Matthew 27;

Mark 15;

Luke 23;

John 18 and 19).

He governed Judea from A.D. 26 to 36.

This slab was discovered in 1961 by an Italian expedition that was excavating the theater at Caesarea Maritima.

The stone was reused in the theater. Originally it was probably part of a temple called a "Tiberium" — that was dedicated to the Roman Emperor Tiberius (A.D. 14–27).





The Province Structure
