





KJV - not commodious.


#### Euroclydon

KJV - Euroklydon.







NT:3712 orguia (org-wee-ah'); from NT:3713; a stretch of the arms, i.e. a fathom: KJV - fathom.



People measured length and weight long before they had rulers and scales. In the past, people used parts of their bodies to measure lengths. Here are some units of length that were based on the human body:




