aneuthetos (an-yoo'-the-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:2111; not well set, i.e. inconvenient:

KJV - not commodious.

## Euroclydon

NT:2148

Eurakulon (yoo-rak-oo'-lohn) or Eurokludon (yoo-rok-loo'dohn); from Euros (the east wind) and NT:2830; a storm from the East (or Southeast), i.e. (in modern phrase) a Levanter:

KJV - Euroklydon.

## quicksands

NT:4950
surtis (soor'-tis); a shoal (from the sand drawn thither by the waves), i.e. the Syrtis Major or great bay on the N. coast of Africa:

KJV - quicksands.



## hope

NT:1680
elpis (el-pece'); from a primary elpo (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence:

KJV - faith, hope.

Adrias (ad-ree'-as); from Adria (a place near the shore);

KJV - Adria.

NT:3712
orguia (org-wee-ah'); from NT:3713; a stretch of the arms, i.e. a fathom:
KJV - fathom.

oregomai (or-eg'-om-ahee); middle voice of apparently a prolonged form of an obsolete primary [compare NT:3735]; to stretch oneself, i.e. reach out after (long for):
KJV - covet after, desire.
